Dear Friends of the parish of White Waltham with Shottesbrooke,

I dare not commit to a weather prediction, but as this magazine finds its way into your hands there may be signs of spring...? And as Alfred Tennyson famously wrote "In the spring a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of love..." [from the poem Locksley Hall].

As we see more sunshine in the day the sap rises, the birds become more colourful and strident and we all may feel more of a spring in our step! I guess that may be why Valentine's day sits in this season so comfortably.



Some people say to me they don't believe in god, and many people live like that. This page is for you. Because I want to ask:

'What god do you not believe in?'

Often when someone describes the picture of god which they don't believe in, it is often a god that I don't believe in either!

In my experience this can impact in a couple of different ways:

You might say "God's all about rules isn't He, spoiling our fun and stopping us doing things we want."

Or you might say "I like the moral code (the rules about life), I just don't want the 'religious' God-and-Jesus bit"

I want to ask:

- Isn't having rules, or a moral code, without any reason or heart to it the worst kind of religiosity or restrictive authoritarianism??!!
- God's 'rules' are often about how we interact with each other as well as the world. Have you thought about how many of God's 'rules' actually help to keep us safe, from physical harm or emotional or spiritual harm?
- Do you think a loving Father, could stand by, whilst his children hurt themselves and each other, without laying down some rules for life?

The Trinity God of the Christian faith speaks from love.

He made you and loves you and knows what is best for you and so does communicate about how to best live in this world, with each other and depending on Him.

When we feel guilty about rejecting God's good plans for us, spoiling relationships and letting ourselves down, He came into the world as Jesus to reach us, to die to provide forgiveness and a new start.

The God of the bible; Father Son and Spirit, is community, is love. His love overflowed to creation, to you and to me, and He longs for us to stop going our own way and hurting ourselves and instead to draw us into His family of love.

NEW CHURCHYARD REGULATIONS

The Diocese of Oxford has introduced new churchyard regulations which require us to remove items which have not been properly authorised.

In particular, the following items are not allowed: any lighting, whether electric or otherwise; any glass shades; kerbs, fencing, railings or other demarcation; stone or glass chippings; individual gardens, including the planting of shrubs; plastic flowers and wreaths (other than poppies of remembrance); toys or other objects which are not part of a properly authorised memorial.

We displayed notices asking people to help us to adhere to these new regulations by removing these items. Any items which were not removed from the Cremation Area were carefully stored so they could be collected by arrangement. It is now nearly two years since the notices were first displayed and, with limited storage space, it has been decided that these remaining items can no longer be kept. Please get in touch as soon as possible if there is something you would like to keep.

If they decide to start learning to ring, we install into one of the bells a clapper brace. This will prevent the clapper from swinging and, therefore, will not strike the bell. Hence, silence will be maintained while teaching is taking place!

If anyone is interested, it will be a good time to start; you will get to know other learners and you will all be at the same stage of learning. White Waltham is a good set of bells to learn on.

Our two novices are getting along well. Eddy is progressing well through his Learning The Ropes Level 2. Our visiting novice from Warfield, Jamal, passed his Level 1 in November.

We had a visiting group from Basingstoke. Check our Facebook page @White Waltham Bell Ringing to see a couple of clips. One is in the ringing chamber (Grandsire Doubles) and the other is outside where a method was just completed, finishing off with them ringing rounds.

At Christmas, we rang for the Christmas Eve Candlelit Carol Service and also the Christmas Day Service. There were only three of us but we still rang out the bells joyously to celebrate the birth of Christ. There was no New Year ringing at White Waltham due to ringers with other commitments.

There is a small amount of work required in the belfry. We are sorting out a problem with the stay on the number 1 bell. Due to the amount of rain over the past few months this has made the wood swell which has affected the stay. The work to be done will prevent the problem from recurring.

With a New Year and a new decade, the council is looking forward to ensuring the best services for our residents and our environment. Our residents require the council to move with the times and provide integrated services to ensure residents are helped wherever and whenever help is needed.

Cllr McWilliams is the newly appointed lead

member for housing and is determined to ensure the council deliver a comprehensive package of cold weather support based on the core principles of compassion, thoroughness and cooperation, including a focus on delivering long term outcomes and actually helping people off the streets.

Anyone sleeping rough in the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead can benefit from the support being delivered through Cold Weather Provision. The provision in place exceeds the council's statutory Severe Weather Emergency Protocol (SWEP) duties and will include a commitment to ensure all rough sleepers are assessed by our experienced outreach team within 10 days of support being offered by any agency. SWEP is activated when temperatures fall below zero for consecutive days.

This new approach will provide bespoke packages of support to individuals sleeping rough and it is hoped people will fully engage with this big offer of help. The approach and the assessment will ensure the offer is appropriate to the individual rough sleeper. The first 10 days working with the rough sleeper are crucial to ensure the roles of each agency are clearly defined and the expectations are managed.

The council is working with homeless charities and other partner organisations to make sure that all rough sleepers know about the provision and are aware of how to access it. We recognise the good work being carried out by our voluntary sector and faith groups, including the community volunteering approach to supporting rough sleepers off the streets, and the Royal Borough's Cold Weather Provision will ensure we are all working together for the best possible outcomes.

Anyone at risk of sleeping rough on the streets should go to the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead offices in the Town Hall in Maidenhead or York House in Windsor for advice and support, or call the housing duty team on 01628 683 803. Anyone who becomes homeless when the offices are closed should contact the council's Emergency Duty Team on 01344 786543.

If you see a rough sleeper you can also call 0300 500 0914 or visit Streetlink giving the details of the rough sleeper and they will notify the relevant local authority.
