

Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

I'd like us to think together about **confounded expectations**! This might be provoked by the good old British weather. When my children were at school in June it was beautifully sunny. Now that they are back in September, it is also beautifully sunny. What happened between???


Maybe we are now cynical about the British summer, or maybe our expectations were confounded.

What are your current expectations? Maybe autumn will be for you a season when things mostly die back, or mostly bear fruit. Maybe you will find surprises.

In the bible we are told the grand story of how humanity turned away from God, rejecting His rule to make up our own minds about right and wrong and who we are. And we also find out how God, lovingly, comes to find us.

God promises to send His king, a mighty one, to: defeat our enemies, rescue us from the mess we have made and bring us back to 'life and life to the full'. But then this king, this messiah, will **confound expectations**.

God sends prophets to speak his truth, and this autumn we will spend some time at church with Isaiah. Through Isaiah God shows us his power and control over all the nations of the world, he is a big God. And yet...

- the one sent, the messiah, will not just be a mighty king but also a servant,

- the messiah will not just be for God's special in-crowd but for anyone, from any nation and walk of life, who will hear his call

- this messiah comes to speak good news and be good news by giving himself up as a substitute in our place, to offer full forgiveness, and a complete, new start.

Expectations confounded, and of course we see those most clearly as we look ahead to the festival (which we won't name yet \bigcirc) where the one is not just the mighty creator of the world, but also a fragile baby ...

If you feel you don't know much about who Jesus is, and what he said and did, we would love it if you came along on a Sunday morning to find out more. Or it is not too late to join our basic course this autumn as we look at the short book of Mark, explore what this good news is, how it confounds our expectations, and share our questions and doubts. Woodlands Park Primary and Nursery School

A place for everyone. Together, we are inspired to grow, learn and achieve.

The school year has started well and it has been lovely welcoming the children back after the summer break. The weather has been kind to us and we have been graced with warm sunshine for the start of term, which makes the return after a long break that much easier.

Whilst the school year finished in July, the school site has been busy over the holidays. We have hosted two summer camps through The Sue Brett Foundation and Premier Education. Over 40 local children benefited from

the wellbeing and sports programmes on offer. We have also had extensive building work with our school roof being replaced and some of our indoor spaces refurbished (including our staff room – see the photo opposite!). Our outside spaces have been improved and those living in close proximity to the school may have seen that the hedges have come down out the front.



You can now see the school from the road; we are quite tucked away on Heywood Avenue, but now the hedges are removed, we can be seen!



Our school site was not the only site getting a makeover, we also have had improvements to our school website. It is the same address as the old one – <u>www.woodlandsparkschool.org</u> but hosted on a new platform. The site features our new school logo and updated photographs of our children. The other major change this year is our school uniform, with many of the children returning after the break, wearing the new uniform, and looking very smart, I might add. We aim to phase the old one out by the end of the year. We are hoping that the uniform ties in more with our Woodlands theme and the children feel proud to wear it.



Later this term, we will be hosting two Open Mornings and, for the first time, an Open Evening. We encourage you to come and visit and see what we are all about. Whilst school numbers have been steadily increasing throughout last year, we still have places in most year groups and so we would encourage prospective parents/carers and pupils of all primary years to visit us.

The Open Mornings will take place on Wednesday 20th and Monday 25th September (9.15-10.15 a.m.) and our Open Evening will be on Wednesday 4th October (6-7.30 p.m.).

Admission applications for our Reception class, in September 2024, needs to be made with the Local Authority by early January; admissions into other year groups can be processed by the School at any time during the year.

We are excited about the new school year and look forward to building on the successes from last year. Please keep an eye out for any of our school events during the year, as we always welcome support from our local community!

Our BBQ takes place once a year, but every Sunday we share fellowship together in our weekly services and over coffee afterwards. You would be very welcome to join us and see for yourself.







This time I decided I really would watch it and my wife & I went to All Saints Church, Marlow, by the bridge for a 09.30 service followed by a large screen transmission for the congregation and other local people. The extra attraction was hot dogs and choc ices, during the interval between the service and the match!!

I know that probably six or seven years ago, I would not have expected to be watching Women's Football and certainly not the Women's World Cup Final! It was a wonderful occasion and brought enormous coverage to such a stunning event, even though England did not win. In reply, Jesus points to the Bible passage:


'Fear the Lord your God, serve him only'.

News from your Borough Councillors

It was certainly a miserable wet summer during the school holidays which was capped with lovely weather just as the schools opened for the Autumn Term. We commiserate with all those who decided not to travel abroad but instead chose England for their holiday destination this year, as whatever destination is always so much more enjoyable in the warmth of the sun.

Local news

RAAC – **Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete:** You may have seen coverage in the news about school closures due to their buildings containing RAAC. We understand this will be a worrying time for schools, parents and pupils but some **good news** as at this stage the council are not aware of any RAAC in any state schools in Maidenhead and only one in the Borough which is in Ascot where RAAC was identified in part of the school in July 2023, and the affected areas were closed. The Responsible Bodies for academies (their academy trust) and voluntary aided schools (the Diocesan authorities) are responsible for their own buildings and for carrying out checks in relation to RAAC.

Congestion in Cannon Lane: Many of you will have been impacted by the congestion in Cannon Lane just by Manor Green School. Cllr Hunt has been heavily involved in meetings since January this year with Manor Green School, council officers and the previous ex councillor – Cabinet Member for Highways. Works were completed at the beginning of



September to alleviate this congestion by widening the access road and gates at the school. This is to ensure traffic on and off site is no longer delayed by the current pinch points where the road on site narrows. Hopefully, all will go well.

Below is a snapshot of council news

Construction starts on 100% affordable housing development in Maidenhead: The Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead has broken ground to officially mark the start of construction of its 100 per cent affordable housing scheme in Maidenhead. The £4m council investment, at 20 Ray Mill Road West, will provide 14 one- and two-bedroom flats. The council's Property Company is delivering the scheme on behalf of the authority. Whilst this scheme is relatively small (and we know some homes labelled 'affordable' may remain out of reach for some) this, nevertheless, demonstrates one way the council can work proactively towards addressing the housing challenge and needs locally.

This is the first such scheme being delivered through the council's Property Company, which is currently exploring other council-owned sites for their potential for similar smaller-sized schemes, from which we are particularly keen to see more social-rent homes delivered.



Sustainable road repair technology used by Royal Borough: The council is carrying out an expanded trial of equipment which is a more sustainable and efficient way of repairing wear and tear in roads, including potholes. A specialist thermal infrared heater, specifically designed to

be used on highways, is used to quickly heat up the existing asphalt surface in need of repair. It is then easily reworked using hand tools before a rejuvenator and fresh material is added to the heated asphalt. The area is then reprofiled level with the surrounding road surface and compacted. The improvements are being carried out by our highways contractor, VolkerHighways.

Royal Borough objects to closure of train station ticket offices: The council has submitted its formal objection letter raising significant accessibility concerns on behalf of the borough's local residents and visitors.

The borough has an ageing population with 18.4% of the population being aged 65 years and over and 12.4% declaring a disability. Windsor is also a major visitor destination which prides itself in welcoming people of different ages and abilities from around the world. The council's concerns include:

- Inaccessibility of machines to wheelchair users due to the height of screen and card reader
- The lack of audio availability and low screen contrast acts as a barrier for users with impaired vision and reduced literacy levels
- The limited provision offered by machines to customers with learning difficulties/disabilities
- Language barriers, as many machines cater only for English speakers
- Wheelchair discounts (50%) are currently only available at a ticket office
- Foreign bank cards are often not accepted by machines




